The theme of the 2017 Commonwealth Local Government Conference is *Fit for the future: resources and capacity for effective local government.*

Local government has a crucial role to play in creating prosperous and thriving communities, ensuring that a people-led, bottom-up approach is at the heart of everything. As the provider of many basic services, such as water, waste, transport, health, housing, education, it is also a major player in development.

The 17 Sustainable Development Goals are the blueprint for development and the achievement of a better world by 2030 and we must ensure that local government is resourced to do this.

Themes

This conference seeks to change the narrative on how we can resource local government for delivery and development. It provides a platform to revisit fiscal decentralisation and local revenue generation and to explore innovative financing models. We will look at how

local governments work with partners as equals; the private sector and civil society on social enterprise, on new ways of raising finance such as green financing and municipal bonds; and how we can use new technologies to work smart and be more effective and efficient.

Join 600 plus delegates from all spheres of government across the Commonwealth – heads of government, ministers, local government leaders and practitioners, research pioneers and the private sector – to discuss these topics through formal and informal sessions – presentations, working groups and debates; complemented by networking opportunities, study visits and a vibrant cultural programme.

A flavour of the working group topics:

- Improving fiscal decentralisation to enable local government to contribute effectively to global development objectives
- Strategies to enhance accountability and transparency
- Innovative partnerships to enhance capital infrastructure
- Municipal bonds and alternative mechanisms and processes for raising and managing local government funding, including community development
- New technologies to facilitate smart working

Held every two years, this is the first time that CLGF's flagship conference is taking place on Malta with a conference venue dating back to the twelfth century and the Knights of St John. Like many other Commonwealth countries, Malta is a small island state but enjoying a well developed economy. You will have the chance to see some local council initiatives during the study visits. Malta is collaborating with the Commonwealth Secretariat to create a Commonwealth Small States Centre of Excellence and is the location of Microsoft's Innovation Centre.

CLGF Research Colloquium 19/20 November 2017

Representatives from universities, policy institutes and local government policy makers from across the Commonwealth will meet before the main conference to present and discuss their research around local government resourcing and capacity. The outcomes of the discussions will be presented to the main conference.

CLGF Youth Forum 21 November 2017

This one day event brings together young councillors, mayors and officials from local governments and ministries with youth civil society champions and entrepreneurs to look at issues around the conference theme, bringing their outcomes to the main conference.

Visas

Malta is part of the European Schengen area and you are likely to need a Schengen visa to enter the country. EU nationals are free to travel to Malta without a visa.

Delegates are responsible for obtaining and paying for their own entry visa. As part of the documentation required to obtain a visa, you will need your registration acceptance letter, which you will receive once you have registered.
