2 Although a minimum 25 percent seats in each council are reserved for women, if the candidate quotas produce less than 25 percent representation, the Election Commission of Sri Lanka (ECSL) lacks an enforcement mandate on anything beyond the candidate nomination process.

The percentage is under the reservation percentage due to a year where no reservations were undertaken for women as well as the revision of constituency boundaries which had an impact on the number of female councillors.
